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<p>Do you have any suggestions about how this course could be improved?</p>	<p>Allowing one to actually see their results of the online quizzes would have been very helpful in knowing how one did and where precisely they need to improve.</p> <p>Dates of assessment tasks could be advertised more clearly. Workload in lectures should be reduced</p> <p>I didn't think the essay was a useful or helpful assignment for understanding the overall course. The lecture was just reading the slides and I wasn't learning much from them. There was a disconnect between examples in the lecture and then the tutorial, I was often re-learning basic things in the tutorial because it wasn't clear in the lecture.</p> <p>I would have appreciated a longer research paper word count. I enjoyed the topic that we had to write about and I thought 1000 words was too short. I would recommend giving a longer word count and a higher weightage to the essay, and compensate that by removing one or two assignments</p> <p>I would like to see the application of these concepts and their relevance to real-life politics, to extend on just the theory.</p> <p>Maybe more practice questions before the quizzes or before the final exam?</p> <p>More answers to problem questions.</p> <p>more discussion of lecture materials in tutes rather than simple maths like exercises (which were relevant but blocked complex discussion of material and opportunity to debate and discuss student thoughts)</p> <p>More feedback for a larger variety of assessment tasks that lets students engage with the course in different ways (ie, a group presentation).</p> <p>Perhaps deviating slightly more from the POLS1008 curriculum</p> <p>possible more engaging lectures</p> <p>The assessment was too easy for a 2nd year course. For someone who had a pretty solid understanding of the content prior to taking the course, the assessment structure did not allow me to show this. Written assignments and a written exam would be better than the multiple choice quizzes and exam we had. This assessment structure does not differentiate between those who know the material and those that don't. More 'advanced' content would be interesting.
